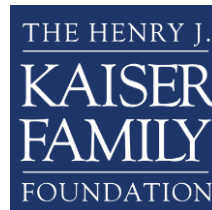

**Tamara Fucile, Director for Government Affairs and Senior Advisor,
Center on Budget and Policy Priorities**

Tamara L. Fucile is Director for Government Affairs and Senior Advisor. In this capacity, she helps direct the Center’s work with federal policymakers and with other national organizations on a broad range of policy issues, including federal budget and appropriations, nutrition programs, and housing issues.



Fucile joined the Center after serving as Associate Director for Legislative Affairs at the Office of Management and Budget from 2014 to 2017. There, she developed the Obama Administration’s congressional outreach strategy and represented the Administration in congressional negotiations related to the President’s budget, regulatory, and management priorities. Prior to joining the Administration, Fucile served as Vice President of Government Affairs for the Center for American Progress. She is also a Capitol Hill veteran, serving in multiple positions for several members. Notably, she served as Deputy Staff Director for Minority Leader Charles Schumer’s Joint Economic Committee and as legislative director for Senator Jeff Merkley, in addition to working for Senator Amy Klobuchar and then-Congressman Edward Markey. Fucile holds her Master’s degree in Business Administration from Georgetown University’s McDonough School of Business and a Bachelor of Arts in political science from the University of Connecticut.

**MaryBeth Musumeci, Associate Director at the Program
on Medicaid and the Uninsured,
Kaiser Family Foundation**

MaryBeth Musumeci is an Associate Director at the Program on Medicaid and the Uninsured, where she concentrates on Medicaid for people with disabilities, including issues related to people dually eligible for Medicare and Medicaid and long-term services and supports. Prior to joining the KFF, she held a Reuschlein Clinical Teaching Fellowship at Villanova University School of Law and spent eight years as a civil legal aid lawyer, most recently as the Deputy Legal Advocacy Director of the Disabilities Law Program at Community Legal Aid Society, Inc. in Wilmington, Delaware, where her practice focused on Medicaid, Supplemental Security Income, other public benefits programs, and civil rights and accessibility issues. Previously, she developed and taught a seminar in Public Benefits Law at Widener University School of Law, clerked in the Delaware Family Court, and held an Independence Foundation Public Interest Law Fellowship representing women transitioning from welfare to work in Chester, Pennsylvania. She received her B.A. with highest honors from Douglass College, Rutgers University and her J.D. from Harvard Law School.
